Part B – The Greek and Latin Classics

The collection contains a number of important literary manuscripts including the famous Milton manuscript (Ms 583) which is for the most part autograph, and a small volume of Byron's letters dated 1813-14, concerning a proposed journey abroad (Ms. 540). Of the earlier English poets there are texts of Piers Plowman (Ms 594); Chaucer, 15th century; Gower, 15th century and Lydgate, 15th century. In addition there is a small selection of Italian poetry including a Boccaccio manuscript of the 15th century. (Ms 218).

The Greek and Latin Classics include a 12th century Horace (Ms. 629), a copy of Livy owned by Thomas a Becket and much else from the 12th century onwards.
