## VI: Secular Manuscripts

Part A — General  
Part B — History

The secular manuscripts constitute one of the largest sections in the collection, yet are the most difficult to summarize. There are a number of medieval texts, but the bulk of the material dates from the 17th and 18th centuries. Included is a large collection of Italian documents which came from the scribe, Jacopo di Castelvetro who taught Italian at Cambridge. Much of the material relates to the University itself, its statutes and its records, and to the men who taught or studied there. Outstanding in this respect are the volumes of Sir Isaac Newton's correspondence,

(a member of the College). Amongst the miscellaneous material there is much to catch the eye, including Price Henry's Copy Books (1602-10) (Ms. 760-7) which includes exercises on justice and on the ideal qualities of kingship, and a book of Greek and Turkish costume from the 17th century. (Ms. 896).

The historical manuscripts are mostly English and cover both ecclesiastic and secular history. They include a 13th century *Historia Scholastica* (Ms. 341), 14th and 15th century chronicles as well as later transcripts made for the Gale family in the 18th century. Later periods are covered in equal measure, and a number of biographies, including Reman's life of Henry V (Ms. 1071) supplement the more general works.
