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RECORDS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF STATE RELATING TO INTERNAL AFFAIRS OF FRANCE, 1910-1929

On the 162 rolls of this microfilm reproduced the records from the decimal file of the Department of State, 1910-29, that relate to internal affairs of France, St. Pierre and Miquelon, Martinique, Guadeloupe, French Guiana, French India, French Indochina, Australasia and Oceania, New Caledonia, Society Islands, Marquesas and Makatea Islands, New Hebrides, Algeria, Tunisia, French West Africa and the Sahara, French Equatorial Africa, French Somali Coast, Madagascar, and other African islands. The records, consisting of bound volumes and unbound documents, are mostly instructions to and despatches from diplomatic and consular officials; the despatches are often accompanied by enclosures. Also included in these records are notes between the Department of State and foreign diplomatic representatives in the United States, memoranda prepared by officials of the Department, and correspondence with officials of other Government departments and with private firms and persons. The Lists of Documents or "purport sheets" filmed on rolls 1-6 give brief abstracts of the documents reproduced in this microfilm publication and serve as a finding aid to the documents themselves. The arrangement of the entries on these lists generally corresponds to the arrangement of the documents in the file.

From 1910 to 1963 the Department of State used a decimal system for its central files, assembling and arranging individual documents according to subject and assigning file numbers. The decimal file consists of nine primary classes numbered O through 8, each covering a broad subject area. The records reproduced in this microfilm publication are in Class 8, Internal Affairs of States. The country number assigned to France is 51; thus the documents bear the file number 851 and relate to internal affairs of France. The several areas included in this series were each assigned a letter, which is placed after the first three digits of the file number. Thus the documents bearing the file number 851a, for example, relate to the internal affairs of St. Pierre and Miquelon. The number that is used after the decimal point represents a specific subtopic. This number, in turn, may be followed by a slant mark (/). In such cases the numbers after the slant mark were assigned to individual documents as they were accumulated on a specific subject. For example, a decimal file number taken from a document reproduced in this microfilm publication is 851.50/85. The number 50 signifies that the subtopic is economic matters, and the number after the slant mark indicates the number of documents on this subtopic.

The documents under one subject classification are generally in chronological order, coinciding with the document number assigned (which follows the slant mark). There are instances, however, when a document file number was not assigned until a date considerably later than one on which the document was received.

Cross-reference sheets referring to related records under other subject classifications in the decimal file have been reproduced as they occur, and appropriate cross-reference notations appear in the Lists of Documents. Other cross-reference notations are to documents in the "numerical file," a system used for the central files of the Department of State for the period 1906-10. The checkmarks that appear by most entries in the left-hand column of the Lists of Documents indicate that the papers are in the file; entries without marks, it is believed, refer to documents that were not among the records when they were received from the Department of State.

Some of the documents that have been checked in the Lists of Documents do not appear in this microfilm publication. The file contains security-classified documents and communications received from and classified by foreign governments and Federal agencies, in addition to those classified by the Department of State. Documents that have not been declassified are not available as part of this publication. The National Archives and Records Service does not have authority to make reproductions of such documents available to searchers.

The records reproduced in this microfilm publication are part of the records in the National Archives designated as General Records of the Department of State, Record Group 59.

In the same record group are several diplomatic correspondence series containing additional documents on relations between France and the United States. There are copies of instructions from the Department of State to diplomatic and consular representatives of the United States, 1785-90 (M61, Foreign Letters of the Continental Congress and the Department of State), and 1791-1331 (M28); to U.S. Ministers to all countries, 1801-33 (rolls 1-8 of M77) and to U.S. Ministers to France, 1829-1906 (rolls 54-64 of M77); notes to foreign ministers and consuls in the United States from the Department, 1793-1834 (M38), and notes to the Prench Legation in the United States from the Department, 1834-1906 (rolls 21-26 of M99); despatches from U.S. Ministers to France to the Department, 1789-1906 (M34); and notes from the French Legation in the United States to the Department, 1789-1906 (M53). Also related to matters concerning France are communications to special agents of the United States from the Department, 1823-86 (rolls 152 and 154 of M77), and some records among despatches from special agents of the United States to the Department, 1794-1906 (M37).

Complementary to the despatches are instructions to consuls.

The method of arranging the diplomatic and consular series cited above was discontinued in 1906, when the Department of State adopted the practice of filling incoming and outgoing correspondence, memorandums, and other documents by subject in a single numerical series. Information on documents relating to France for the 1906-10 period may be found through the use of card indexes and Lists of Documents in the National Archives.

Among the records in the same record group, in Class 7 of the Department of State decimal file, 1910-29, are two other series regarding French affairs that are closely related to the records reproduced in this microfilm publication. One concerns political relations between the United States and France (M568), and the other is political relations between France and Other States (M569). Also reproduced on microfilm are three related series concerning Morocco, 1910-29: internal affairs (M577), political relations with the United States (M573), and political relations with other states (M579).

In Records of the Foreign Service Posts of the Department of State, Record Group 84, are records originally kept at U.S diplomatic and consular posts. Among them are records of the U.S. Legation (later Embassy) in France, 1783-1935, and records of consular posts in that country. Available on microfilm is the correspondence of the U.S. Legation in France, 1835-42 (M14).

Other records relating to France are in Records of Boundary and Claims Commissions and Arbitrations, Record Group 76. Among them are documents relating to the Claims Commissions of 1803, 1831, and 1830-93, in which France and the United States participated.

Records relating to France are also among Records of the American Commission To Negotiate Peace, Record Group 256.

The records reproduced in this microfilm publication were prepared for filming by Ralph E. Huss, who wrote these introductory remarks and provided the other editorial material.
